Please also add:

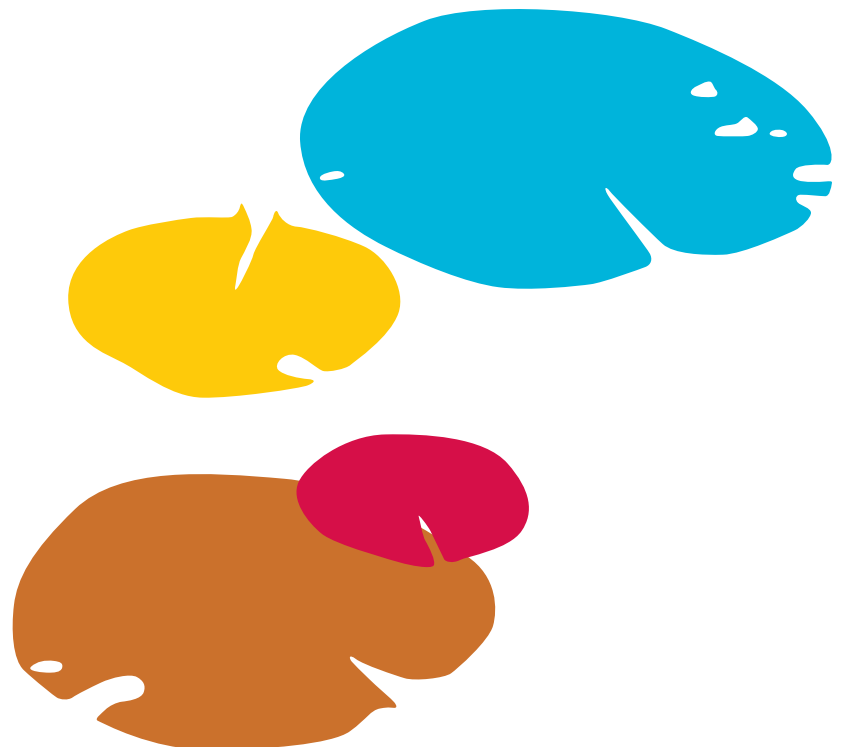
- Natural objects such as a feather, special leaf, pressed flower or tiny piece of bark

Water shadows quiver on the tree trunks

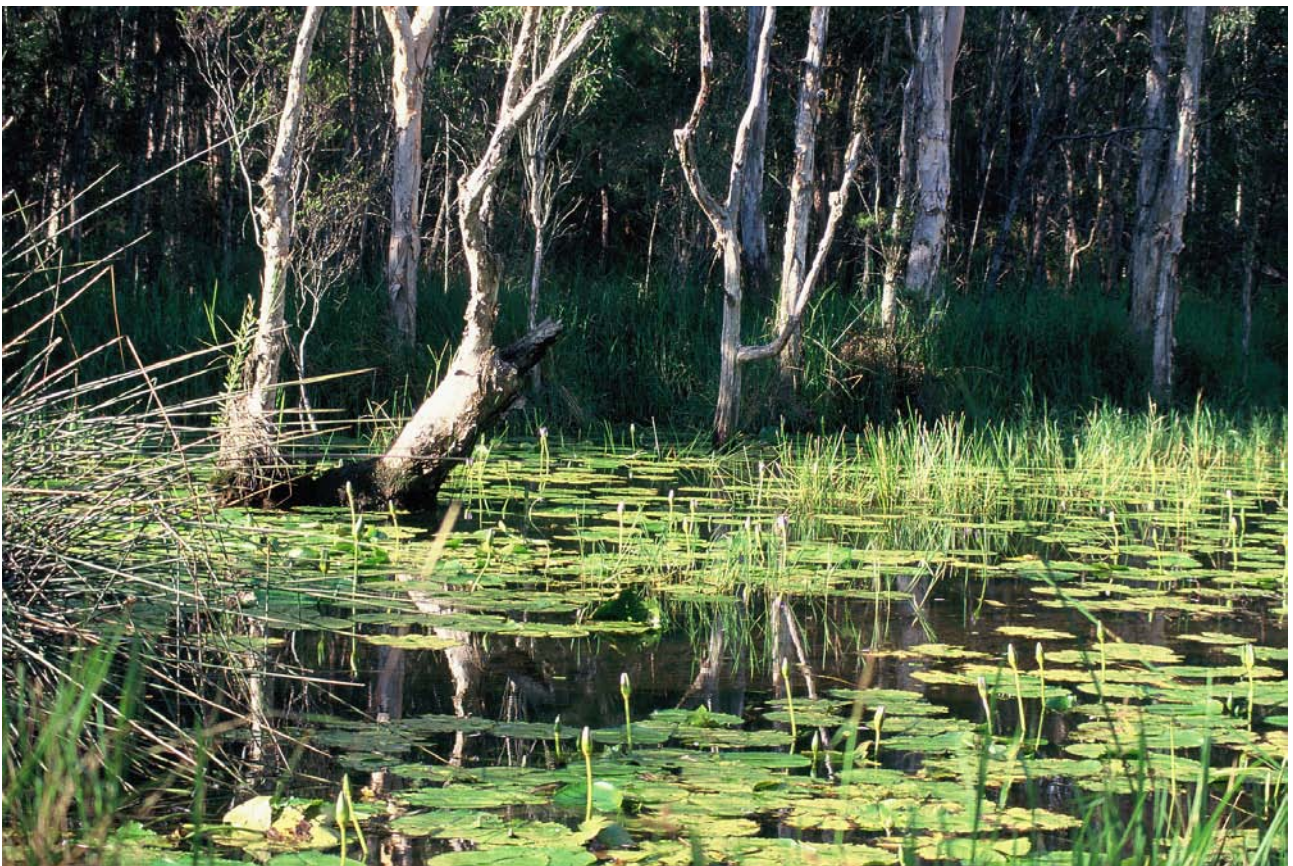
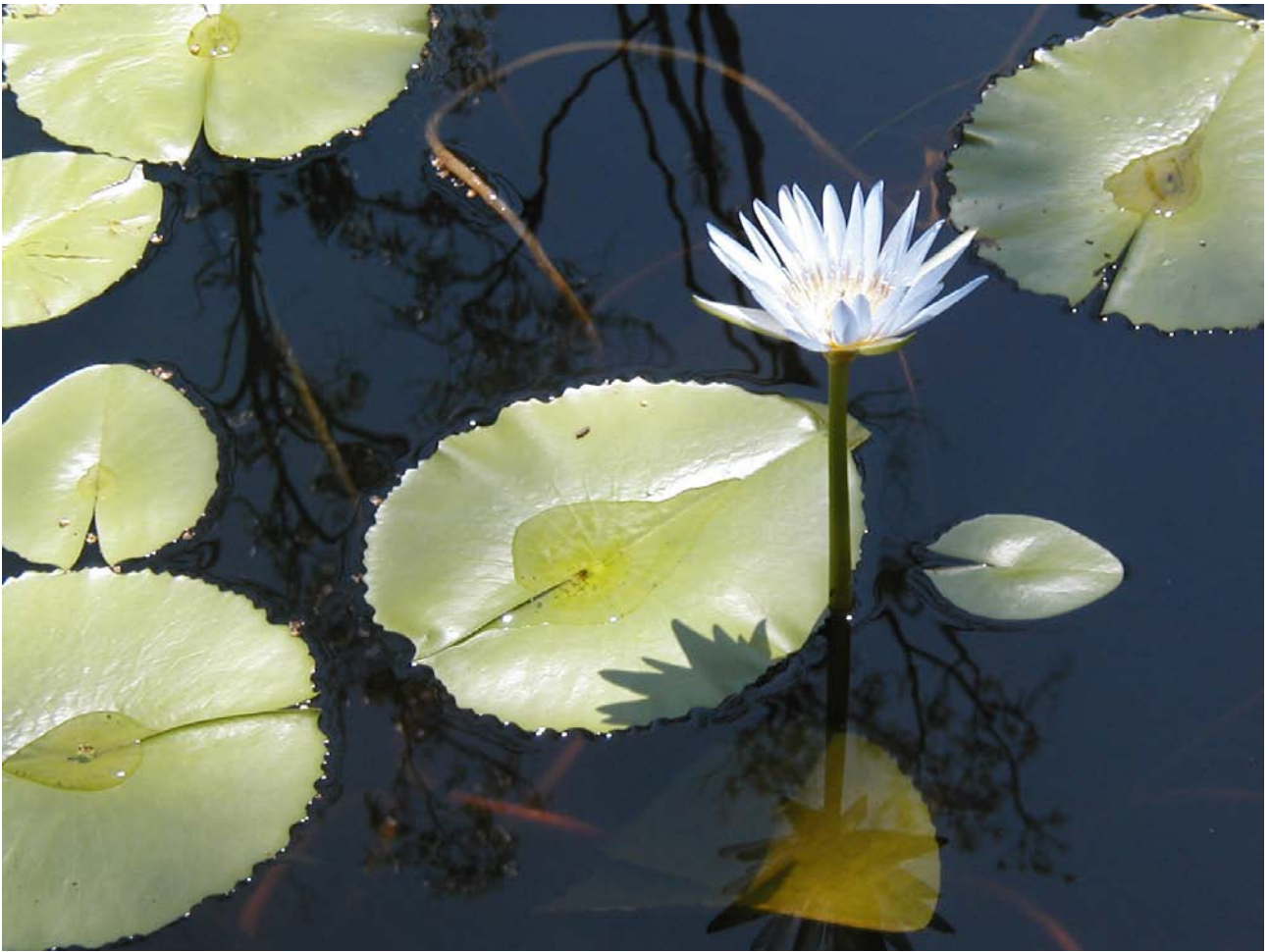

BIRD-FRIENDLY GARDEN CHECKLIST:

- Grow Australian native plants such as grevilleas, banksias and bottlebrush (*Callistemon* varieties), but go for a range of sizes and types, to provide food and shelter for a wide variety of birds.
- Make sure there's something in flower every month of the year in your garden.
- Some exotic plants are OK for birds.
- Provide clean, fresh water in a bird-bath, and make it part of your routine to replace the water regularly.
- Site the birdbath so you can enjoy the show, but also make sure the bird-bath is safe from attack by predators.
- Offer food such as a good quality commercial mixed bird seed, or put out a nectar mix (see page 9 for details).

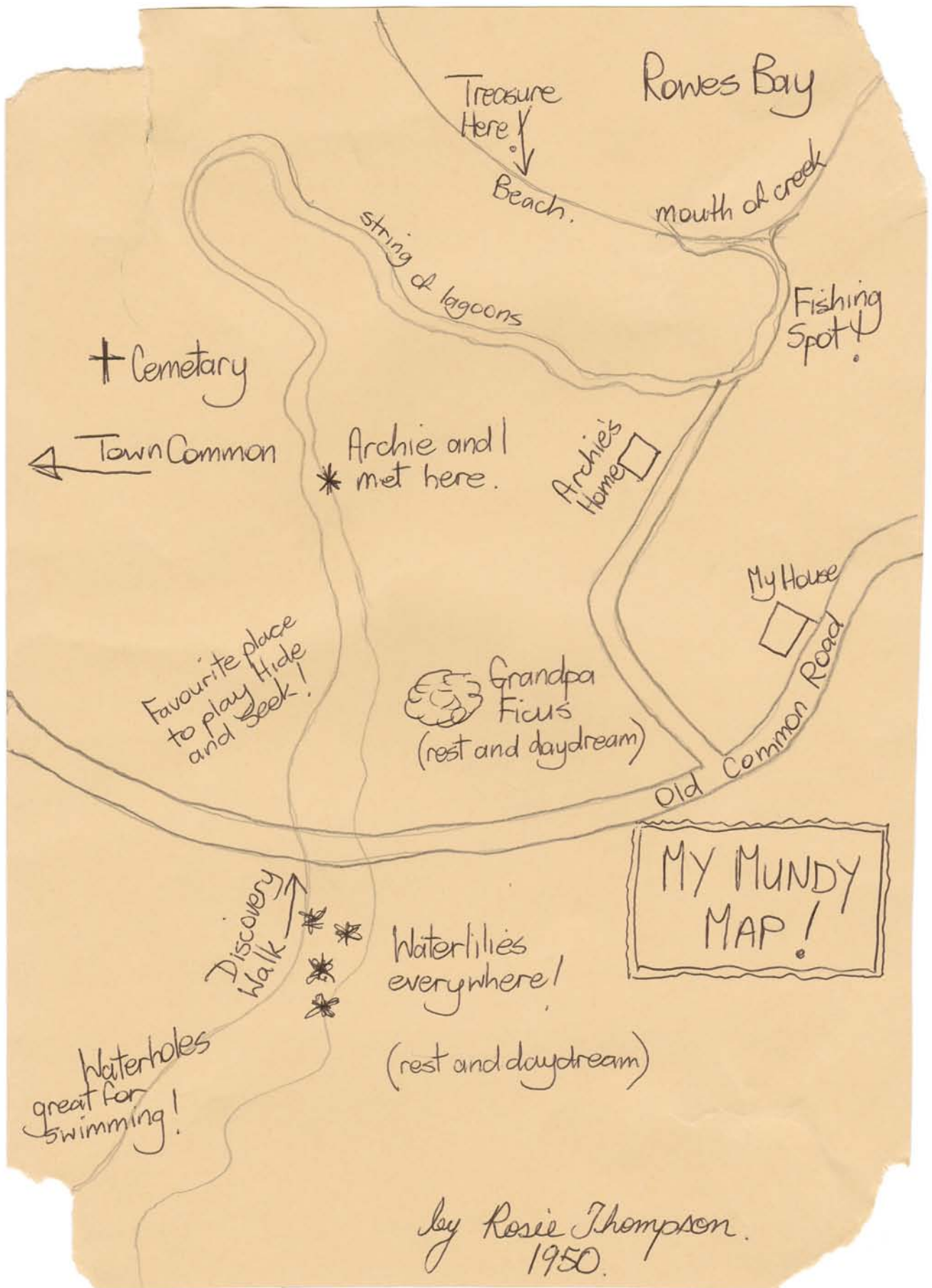
